Dear Members and Friends,

As I write the Sunday evening before Thanksgiving, among other things on my rather disheveled desktop are **three special items:** (1) The delightful Koldyk twins, Samantha and Janet, gave me a package of my all-time favorite German gingerbread cookies (*"lebkuchen," which they received from an aunt living in Germany*) both in appreciation of the fun children's sermons and to wish me a Happy Thanksgiving (*they also informed me they used their "awards" from last week to buy more kitty food for the homeless kitties!*), (2) a **\$10,000 (!)** check to the church quietly given me this morning by a faithful member "... in gratitude to God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit," and (3) this note I received from Evelyn Murray, which I read to the congregation last Sunday:

I would like to express my love for, and deepest gratitude to, all those who offered up their prayers, energy, strength, time, worldly goods and funds to help Julia Porcaro and her three girls move on yesterday to a new phase in their lives, one we all hope will be filled with peace, surrounded by our love and support, with a renewed dedication to serving our Lord and helping all those whose lives we have the power to enrich!

As many of you know, the Porcaro family faced the unexpected and tragic passing of loving husband, devoted father and industrious sole provider Charles this past July, leaving a huge void in their lives as well as creating many practical needs. Many of you helped the bereaved family move to a new apartment November 14; quality donations of needed furniture, truck rental, manpower (*and womanpower!*), and other generous contributions (*both financial and practical*) came together in an almost miraculous manner coordinated largely by Evelyn and other Presbyterian Women. **On a related note**, the Porcaros' needs continue; this past Thursday, the Deacons established the **Porcaro Relief Fund**. MEMBER CARE COMMITTEE

On Sunday, November 15, we welcomed eleven new members into our Greenwood Church family. As is his custom, at the Session meeting to vote on receiving our new members, Pastor Clark asked all present to tell something about how they came to Greenwood Church. In the current class, some were first attracted to Greenwood by Vacation Bible School or an invitation from a friend, but all agreed that a big part of their decisions to become members was the warm welcome they received. You never know when you reach out and greet the person next to you on Sunday morning what an impact that simple act can have. One of our "new" members told her story, a story that with her permission I want to share with you all.



It was 1977. An independent young woman who had grown up attending a Methodist church with her family decided to visit other churches in the area to see what they were like. At all but one of these churches, she was able to attend the service and slip out unnoticed, but not at Greenwood Church. A friendly woman sitting nearby (perhaps Betty Mason?) greeted her warmly after the service and, surprised to see a teenaged girl in church alone, asked if everything was all right. The young girl enthusiastically responded that yes, thank you, everything is just fine, and that she had liked the service and planned to come again. When she told her parents about the warm, friendly church she had discovered, her mother told her that Greenwood was the church their friends Fran and Jim Bonn belonged to; and a plan was made for the whole family to visit. They must have liked it because on November 11, 1977, Charles, Florence, Janice, Virginia, and Linda Hachadorian became members of Greenwood Community Church.

But that's not the end of the story. As many of you know, Janice's mother Florence has served the church in all sorts of ways, as a Deacon, PW member, leader of the collations committee, and more. Her father, Charles, was the junior high Sunday School teacher for many years and a valuable member of the Session. Sister Ginny (Jacobs now) has also served as a Deacon, sings in the choir, and is our energetic Director of Family Ministries. In that role she is directly responsible for bringing many new members into our Greenwood family, including several other members of this year's class. Then we get to the next generation. Ginny's children Jessy, Jaime, and Jillian are contributing in their own ways in music and Christian Education. Jaime, like his Mom and Grandmother, is also serving as a Deacon, along with his wife, Marilyn. In January 1997 Janice and her husband Jeff Black brought their son John to Greenwood to be baptized – and now he is our Director of Music, Choir Director, and Organist. (I remember when, as a wee lad of about five or six, John insisted that he be allowed to accompany us on the piano when we sang in Children's Church.) His sister Christian is also sharing her considerable musical talents to enrich our worship services. Think of it – all of these contributions stemming from one member who reached out and made a visitor feel sincerely welcome!

I don't think this is all just chance. I believe that from the very beginning the Holy Spirit has been guiding the people of Greenwood Church and giving them the grace to love and care for one another. Another example of this is the outpouring of support from the church as our members pooled their talents to help Julia Porcaro and her daughters find a new place to live, donated or located needed items of furniture, orchestrated the move so it went smoothly, and supplied man (and woman) power to carry boxes, bags, and furniture. It was amazing to see it all come together, thanks to the many, many hours invested by people who follow Jesus' call to love and help our neighbors.

We need you all to be part of this ongoing effort. Welcome our visitors, and/or let someone on the Committee know if you notice someone hasn't been in church in a while. Give us a call if you or someone else needs help in ways big or small.

PEACE CORPS UPDATE FROM NICARAGUA: **Amanda David** has completed the intensive language and cultural training needed to serve with the Peace Corps in Nicaragua for the next two years. She was sworn in on Saturday, November 14 and moved into her new village on Sunday, November 15. Amanda will serve in a small village in the District of Boaco. The District of Boaco is located in the mountains east of the capitol of Managua. She will be teaching English alongside native teachers at the secondary or university level. She has been assigned to work with six native teachers and once a week will travel to a remote area of the country to work with teen-age natives. She will be challenged with finding food that agrees with her, and confronting her "love" of spiders and bugs. The worker who is just finishing up in her village warned her about tarantulas and scorpions in her house – and said not to leave any clothing on the floor.
