



MISSION REPORT
2021 OGHS Disbursements

Thank you to everyone who so generously supported One Great Hour of Sharing during this Lenten season. The Mission Committee raised \$3,590.50 and the following allocations were made to support our brothers and sisters in need both here and around the world.

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (U.S.A.) OGHS (\$500) The One Great Hour of Sharing Program makes the love of Christ real for individuals and communities around the world by addressing needs in the areas of disaster assistance, hunger and self-development.

VOICE OF THE MARTYRS (\$700) It's a difficult, dangerous and often illegal task, but front-line workers are risking their lives to get God's Word into the hands of those who otherwise might never receive it. We can help ensure that every Christian in more than sixty nations, such as Cuba, North Korea, China and Iraq, has his or her own copy of the Bible.

WISH (WEST INDIES SELF HELP) (\$500) is a relief and development mission located on LaGonave Island, fifteen miles off the mainland of Haiti. A major focus of the mission has been to provide a safe and reliable source of water. Our support will be designated to provide water fountains. Water is core to life and to the ministry of WISH. We provide water for a village of over 30,000 people at 19 fountains. These fountains are strategically located to serve the neighborhoods of the village. The fountains are in need of an update. It costs approximately \$10,000 to replace each fountain, which includes the pipes.

SAMARITAN'S PURSE/ETHIOPIA (\$500) As hundreds of thousands of people fled to more populated areas of Tigray last fall, there were many stories of suffering and hunger. Thousands of displaced children and nursing and pregnant mothers were increasingly at risk of malnutrition. Some families were reduced to begging for food, and many simply went days or longer without eating. For months, Samaritan's Purse has been working hard to help in this dire situation, providing ongoing nutrition and feeding relief. In addition to the ready-to-use supplemental food (RUSF) items that are airlifted aboard Samaritan's Purse DC-8 aircraft earlier this year; Samaritan's Purse is also providing tens of thousands of families with a month's worth of wheat, beans, cooking oil, and other staples.

TIM TEBOW FOUNDATION "RESCUE THEM" ... FIGHTING /HUMAN TRAFFICKING (\$500) It has been estimated that as often as every two minutes around the world, a vulnerable life is being bought and sold as if it were merely a commodity to be traded. Human beings – image bearers of God – are being captured, exploited, abused and bound as modern-day slaves. The exact numbers are hard to track, often inconsistent, and presumably underreported, yet they are a global reality steadily and even exponentially trending at an alarming pace.

DAYS FOR GIRLS (\$500) Recommended by our mission partners Chris and Greg Callison in Iraq, DAYS FOR GIRLS (www.daysforgirls.org) is a nonprofit international organization that works to "increase access to menstrual care and education by developing global partnerships, cultivating Social Entrepreneurs, mobilizing volunteers and innovating sustainable solutions that shatter stigma and limitations for women and girls."

KARANDA HOSPITAL, ZIMBABWE/FOOD PACKS (\$490.50) In our mission partner Kiersten Hutchinson's recent video, Kiersten mentioned that because rampant inflation has returned this last year, there is a dire need for basic food supplies to help sustain the staff of Karanda Hospital. PAPA (a local mission agency) and the hospital have graciously been supporting monthly food packs, which supply the basic needs for the family at a cost of \$30 per pack.
